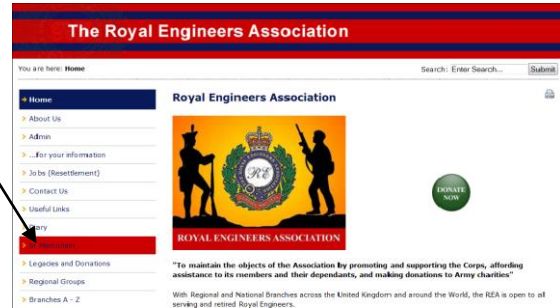


How to access the Corps Memorial Book and how to add a dedication on the Friends & Relations website

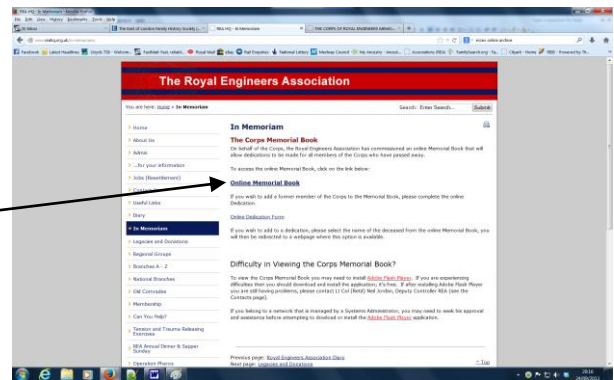
The easiest way to access the Corps Memorial Book is via the Royal Engineers Association (REA) website.

Simply press Ctrl and click on this link to access the REA website: <http://www.reahq.org.uk>

Once on the site, click on the option 'In Memoriam'



You will then see this screen:

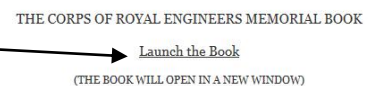


Now click on the link 'Online Memorial Book'

You will be taken to a new window showing this:

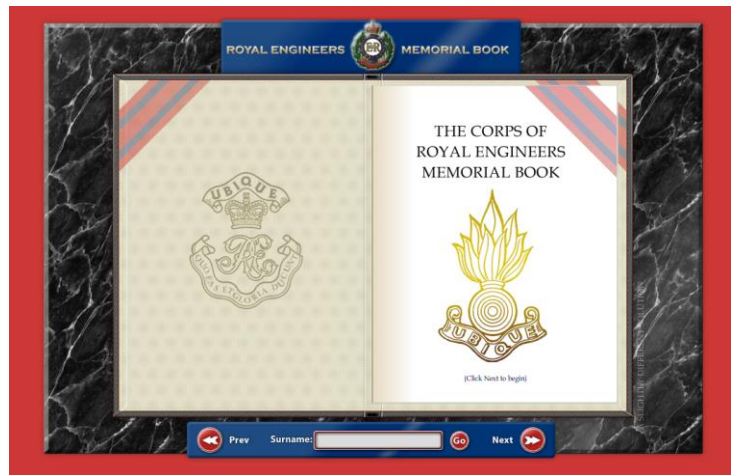


Click on 'Launch the Book'

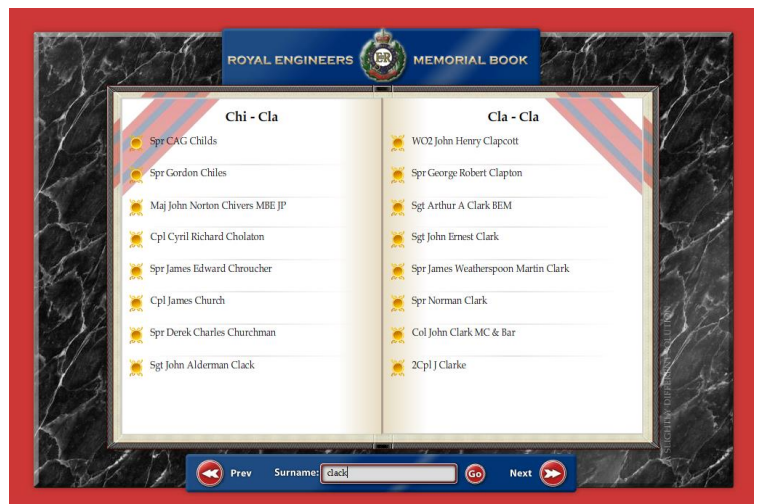


The Book will open in a new window.

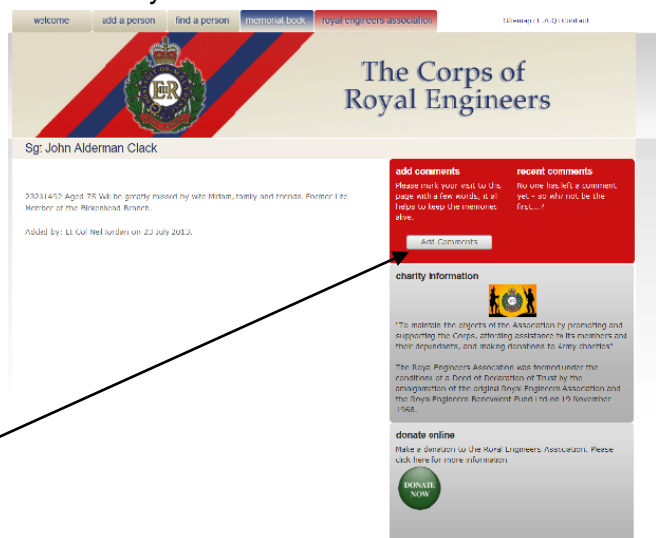
You will now see this screen:



Enter the surname in the box marked 'Surname' and click on 'Go'. If the name exists you will be taken to the relevant page. If the name does not exist, the application will tell you so.



Click on the person for whom you are searching. This will take you to the Friends & Relations website and show The Sapper magazine obituary for that person.



Now click on the 'Add Comments' box
